 - Available Positions: Melbourne, Adelaide, Sydney, Perth, Newcastle, Hobart, Launceston, Brisbane, Tasmania, Auckland.
 - Term: 1 year

National Student Coordinator

Responsibilities

- Liaising and supporting ASSBI's student team leaders and representatives across Australia throughout the year
- Liaising with the executive committee regarding student events (e.g., executive summaries and attendance at executive meetings)
- Providing innovative ways to further promote student engagement
- Active role in helping to plan the annual conference program for students, with support from the executive
- Responsible for the recruitment of student ambassadors nationwide across our many cities (e.g., Melbourne, Sydney, Newcastle, Tasmania, Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth, etc.)
- All applicants must be able to commit to a full 2-year term position

Team Leader

Responsibilities

- Lead the planning and organisation of up to two student ASSBI events per year (e.g., seminar, workshop, movie night, etc.) where students are invited to attend, network and are encouraged to participate and learn more about ASSBI
- Liaise with the student coordinator and communicate the team's progress throughout the year
- Coordinate and liaise with your team of student ambassadors
- Conduct regular meetings with your team of student ambassadors
- Help promote ASSBI to your wider networks (it is expected that all team members are responsible for the active promotion of ASSBI throughout this process)

Student Ambassador

Responsibilities

- Organise with your team up to two student ASSBI events per year (e.g., seminar, workshop, movie night, etc.) where students are invited to attend, network and are encouraged to participate and learn more about ASSBI.
- Work together with fellow student ambassadors who represent a range of disciplines (e.g., psychology, speech pathology, occupational therapy, neuropsychology)
- Help promote ASSBI to your wider student networks.
- Attend team meetings and liaise regularly with your team leader.
